### 2012 Domaine Gayda IGP Pays d'Oc Villa Mon Reve

Another serious effort, the 2012 Villa Mon Rêve is 100% Syrah that comes from a single plot of north facing, higher elevation vines. Partially destemmed and aged 24 months in older foudre, it offers stunning purity of fruit to go with impressive notes of blueberries, violets, lilac and hints of chocolate on the nose. Medium to full-bodied, seamless and layered, with sweet tannin, it has an approachable feel, yet I suspect it will evolve gracefully. Enjoy it anytime over the coming 7-8 years.

An outstanding effort, the inky purple colored 2012 Chemin de Moscou checks in as a serious blend of 62% Syrah, 32% Grenache and 6% Cinsault that spent 21 months in barrel; the Syrah in new oak and the Grenache and Cinsault in 1-2-year-old barrels. It has a rocking bouquet of sweet black raspberry, crème de cassis, licorice, crushed flowers and sweet spice. This give way to a medium to full-bodied, pure, elegant effort that has terrific purity of fruit, no hard edges, and a clean, focused finish. Count me as a fan, and this is a rock solid bottle of wine that will drink nicely for 5-6 years, probably longer.

A borderline outstanding white, Domaine Gayda's 2013 Figure Libre Freestyle Blanc is made from 55% Grenache Blanc, 15% Marsanne, 10% Roussanne and the reset Chenin Blanc and Maccabeu. Medium-bodied, nicely textured, yet still fresh, clean and with impressive purity of fruit, it gives up subtle minerality as well as plenty of white peach, apple and brioche. It's a good value and will impress for 1-2 years.

The 2013 Figure Libre Freestyle Rouge is a borderline outstanding blend of 45% Syrah, 25% Grenache, 20% Carignan and 10% Mourvèdre that was vinified in stainless steel and aged in 12 months in older barrels and tank. It offers lots of plum, licorice and crushed herbs, medium to full-bodied richness, solid purity of fruit and character filled, well-made profile. It should drink nicely for at least 4-5 years.

The 2013 Figure Libre Cabernet Franc offers perfumed, slightly exotic notes of lilac, violets, sweet black cherries and black raspberry. This give way to a medium-bodied, supple, nicely textured red that has good freshness, plenty of fruit and a delicious, well-made profile that's hard to resist. I don't think it will make old bones, but it's a solid effort to drink over the coming 3-4 years.
